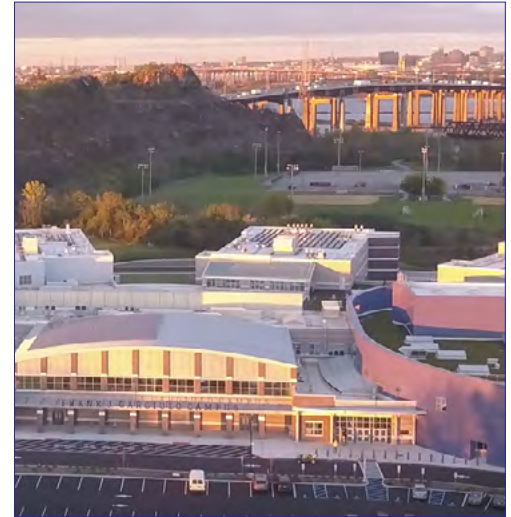

Priority Registration for Veterans of the US Armed Forces:
Begins Thursday, Thursday, October 31, 2019 in person at both campuses. To be eligible for priority registration, Veterans must show proof of service, which includes DD-214, Military ID or Eligibility Letter.

Payment Deadline for **Winter 2020:**

Payment is due in full by the first day of the term: Friday, January 3, 2020 by 5 p.m.



Payment Deadlines for **Spring 2020:**

- If registered from the start of registration through Friday, December 20, 2019, must pay in full, make payment plan arrangement, or have financial aid awards in place by Friday, January 3 by 5 p.m.
- If registered between Saturday, December 21, 2019 through Thursday, January 23, 2020, must pay in full, make payment plan arrangement, or have financial aid awards in place by Friday, January 24, 2020 by 5 p.m.
- If registered on Friday, January 24, 2020 or after, must pay in full, make payment plan arrangement, or have financial aid awards in place at the time of registration.

**** NOTE:**

Payment plans can be arranged either in person, online, or over the phone with the Bursar's Office.

Missed Payments:

- Students who do not pay in full, make a payment plan arrangement, or have financial aid awards in place by their due date risk having all classes dropped and will need to re-register within the published add/drop period. Please see your Registration Statement for due dates.
- Students will not be reinstated after the add/drop period has ended.
- Students who register on Friday, January 24, 2020 or later will be financially responsible for all charges and will not be dropped for non-payment. Please adhere to the published add/drop deadlines.

Registration Fee - This fee is a flat fee charged once per semester and is used to cover costs associated with the processing of registrations.

Student Activity Fee - This fee is charged per credit hour to all students enrolled in courses for credit. The funds contribute to the support of Student Clubs and organizations, student activities, publications and Student Government services.

Technology Fee - This fee is charged per credit hour to all students enrolled in courses for credit. The funds are used to offset costs, and maintain and upgrade all student lab equipment, library automation and other instructional technology.

General Service Fee - This fee is charged per credit hour to all students enrolled in courses for credit. The funds contribute to the support of construction, restoration, and maintenance for various student academic facilities on campus. This revenue also supports services not funded by the State, such as free transportation between campuses.



How do I know my Username and Password?

Username: Your username is the First Name Initial + Last Name + Last 4 digits of Student ID + @live.hccc.edu

Password: Your temporary password is Date of Birth as MMDDYY format.

Example: Name: John Smith
Student ID: 0011223
Birth Date: January 1, 1995

Result: Username: jsmith1223@live.hccc.edu
Password: 010195
(For security, be sure to change your password after logging in.)

Unless otherwise indicated, you will need the credentials above to access many of the services listed. (Please note: Passwords expire 245 days after your first log in or password reset)

You are expected to check your HCCC email for important updates.

New Student Accounts

Can I log in to my account immediately after I apply?

Yes. Once you apply and are accepted to HCCC, you will receive an email with instructions on your Username and Password to access the MyHudson student portal. Instructions will be sent to the email address you entered in your application to HCCC. Be sure to check your spam folder if you haven't received this email within 24 hours of your application.

Faculty will use this system to communicate with students and share documents that are related to their courses. Testing FAQ's

What is the College Placement Test (CPT)?

HCCC uses College Board's Accuplacer as the official placement tool to determine your college readiness in English and Math prior to course registration.

When do I have to take the College Placement Test (CPT)?

Students can take the CPT after applying to HCCC and receiving their 7-digit student ID number. The earlier you test, the sooner you can secure your schedule for the semester.

Do I have to take the CPT?

Your counselor will need to know your course placement in English and Math prior to course registration.

You may be exempt from the CPT if you have:

- College-level English and/or Math credit from another accredited college/university
- Accuplacer scores from another Testing Center
- Qualifying SAT scores
- Qualifying AP scores
- Qualifying Junior/Senior High School GPA
- Qualifying TOEFL scores
- Qualifying GED scores

What happens if I fail the CPT?

The CPT is not a Pass/Fail test. The scores are used to determine course placement in English, Math, and ESL (if needed). Writing score ranges from 0-8; Next-Generation sections have a score range of 200-300; ESL computerized sections have a score range of 20-120; ESL Essay levels range from 0-4. HCCC offers different levels of pre-college English, ESL, and Math courses to help you succeed in future college-level courses.

Note: Pre-college courses do not count towards graduation requirements.

What subject areas are covered on the standard placement test? How long is the test?

The standard College Placement Test is composed of 2-4 computerized sections:

1. Writing (typed essay/1 hour time limit)
2. Next-Generation Reading (20 multiple-choice questions/untimed); a score of 7+ on the Writing will exempt you from this section of the placement test.
3. Next-Generation Quantitative Reasoning, Algebra, and Statistics (20 multiple-choice questions/untimed)
4. An additional math section may be required depending on your Next-Generation QAS score.

The test is approximately 2-3 hours.

What is the Writing Proficiency Test (WPT)?

How long is the test?

The WPT is required for ENG 101 transcripts (C grade or higher) that are older than 10 years. Students will receive ENG 101 transfer credit upon passing the test with a score of a 7 or higher. The WPT is a 90-minute hand-written exam.

What subject areas are covered on the English as a Second Language (ESL) placement test? How long is the test?

The ESL placement test is composed of 3 computerized sections and essay:

1. ESL Essay (handwritten/1 hour time limit)
2. ESL Reading Skills (20 multiple-choice questions/untimed)
3. ESL Language Usage (20 multiple-choice questions/untimed)
4. ESL Listening (20 multiple-choice questions/untimed)

The test is approximately 2.5-3.5 hours.

Why is it important for me to study and prepare for the CPT?

HCCC wants to make sure you are accurately placed into English and Math courses based on your academic needs and skills. The number of pre-college courses you take will impact Financial Aid and the time it will take you to complete degree requirements. Studying and brushing up before taking the test will help you save time and money!

How can I prepare for the CPT?

The Testing & Assessment website offers many free study tools for English, Math, and ESL. Sign up for a free EdReady account to brush up on your Math and English skills: www.hccc.edu/testing

I'm not happy with my CPT results. Can I take the test again?

Students who take the standard CPT sections are eligible for 1 retest (\$5 fee). Course placement will be based on the highest set of scores. Students can elect to study on their own, or sign up for in-person intervention. Re-test fee is waived for students who successfully complete:

- EdReady Math or English Study Plan
- Boot Camp
- Summer Bridge
- EOF Program

Can I use a calculator?

Although hand-held calculators are not permitted, students will have access to the calculator function that is built into specific Next-Generation Math questions. Scrap paper is available at all testing stations. Note: Only students with approved testing accommodations will be allowed to use a hand-held calculator.

How can I set up testing accommodations (e.g., extended time)?

Students who require accommodations for the CPT will need to meet with Disability Support Services in advance. Please schedule your appointment at (201) 360-4157.

When can I take the test?

Testing is offered on most weekdays at the Journal Square campus and select weekdays at the North Hudson Campus. To view the most current testing schedule, please visit www.hccc.edu/testing.

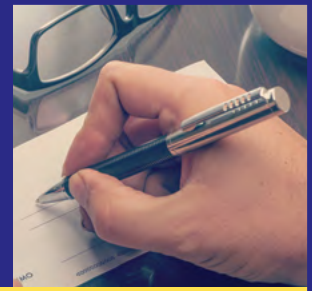

Payment Deadline for Winter 2020:

Payment is due in full by the first day of the term: Friday, January 3, 2020

Payment Deadlines for Spring 2020:

- If registered from the start of registration through Friday, December 20, 2019, must pay in full, make payment plan arrangement, or have financial aid awards in place by Thursday, January 3, 2020 by 5 p.m.
- If registered between Saturday, December 21, 2019 through Thursday, January 23, 2020, must pay in full, make payment plan arrangement, or have financial aid awards in place by Friday, January 24, 2020 by 5 p.m.

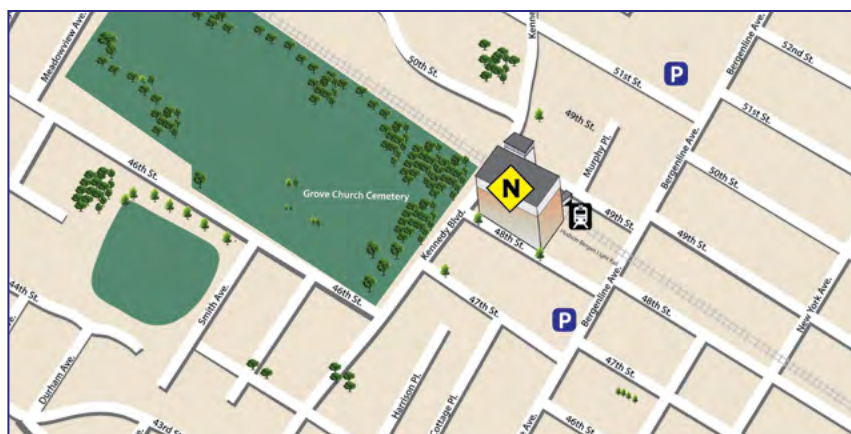
