



Jersey City-born pop artist Miguel Cardenas worked as an architect for a number of years. He received a Bachelor of Architecture degree from Pratt Institute and a master's degree in Advanced Architectural Design and Theory from Columbia University. He currently practices as a freelance architectural designer and works fulltime with autistic students at Dickinson High School's Special Education Department. Cardenas' digital collages attempt to blur the line between art and design by creating a narrative of associations. Architectonic spatial concepts are applied by overlaying juxtaposing appropriated images and text taken from art history, social history, as well as pop culture. His work attempts to inhabit the ambiguous, interstitial space or grey zone that exists between binary oppositions - where things are not "either/or," but "both/ and."


