PAYMENT DEADLINE FOR WINTER/SPRING 2026



Payment Deadline for Winter Intercession:

Payment is due by the end of the term: **Thursday, January 22, 2026**

Payment Deadline for Spring:

If registered from the start of registration through Thursday, August 28, 2026 must pay in full make payment plan arrangement or have financial aid awards in place by **Friday, January 23, 2026**. If registered after **Friday, January 23, 2026** must pay in full make payment plan arrangement or have financial aid awards in place at the time of registration.

Missed Payments:

Students who do not make a payment or payment arrangement by the due date risk having all classes dropped and will need to re-register within the published add/drop period. Students will not be reinstated after the add/drop period has ended. Students who register on **Friday, January 23, 2026** or later will be financially responsible for all charges and will not be dropped for non-payment. Please adhere to the published add/drop deadlines.

Students should contact the program coordinators, or refer to each program's website, for further information. The above schedule does not include lab or other fees that may apply. Per April 2024 Board Approval, International/Out-of-State tuition rates have been eliminated.

Registration Fee - This fee is a flat fee charged once per semester and is used to cover costs associated with the processing of registrations.

Student Life Fee - This fee is charged per credit hour to all students enrolled in courses for credit. Departments and programs receiving funding from this fee may include: Student Life and Leadership, Student Government Association, Student Clubs and Activities, Athletics, Honor Societies, Cultural Affairs, Career Services, Advising & Transfer, Academic Affairs, and costs related to graduation events, Commencement.

Program Technology Fee - This fee is charged per credit hour to all students enrolled in courses for credit. The funds are used to offset costs, and maintain and upgrade all student lab equipment, library automation and other instructional technology, in addition to support cyber security mandates and hardware.

General Service Fee - This fee is charged per credit hour to all students enrolled in courses for credit. The funds contribute to the support of construction, restoration, and maintenance for various student academic facilities on campus. This revenue also supports services not funded by the State, such as free transportation between campuses and parking expenses.



Educational Opportunity Fund

The EOF Program is a department within the Center for Academic & Student Success

For over 50 Years, EOF has provided students from educationally and economically disadvantaged backgrounds an opportunity to pursue a college degree. Created by statute in 1968, EOF has provided thousands of EOF New Jersey students with academic, financial, and social support. EOF has been integral

to Hudson County Community College (HCCC) since the late 1970s. EOF is a program that is dedicated to ensuring in-school academic success. Our dedicated team of advisors academic practice professionals and instructors work closely with EOF students to assist them in earning their college degrees.

What services are offered to HCCC EOF students?

- Academic advisement counseling and academic practice sessions
- Early start on college by attending our Summer Academy
- Workshops, cultural trips and activities
- Class registration from their EOF advisor
- Mentoring from experienced EOF students
- Career advisement and guidance on transferring to 4-year colleges
- Financial assistance up to \$800 based on the State of New Jersey eligibility.
- The opportunity to transfer into an EOF program at future 4-year NJ institutions

Who is eligible for EOF at HCCC?

To be eligible for consideration an applicant must:

- Be a student from an educationally and/or economically disadvantaged background
- Have been a New Jersey resident for at least one year
- Meet the financial eligibility requirements as defined by the State of New Jersey
- Be a currently enrolled HCCC student

How do I apply to be an EOF student?

- Complete an HCCC application (new HCCC students)

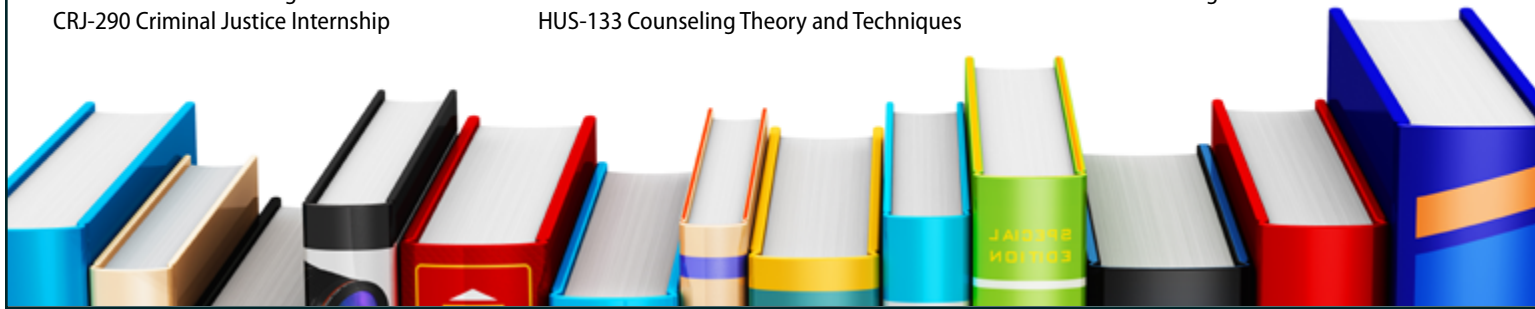

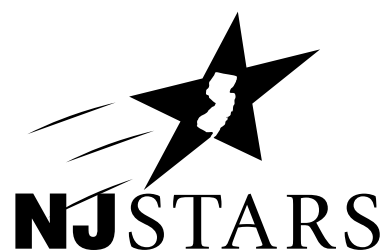

The Self-Service Financial Aid guides you through the Financial Aid process using a web-based process and interactive checklist. You can view each step of the application process with clear instructions on documentation.

Account Summary – view a summary of your account which includes amount overdue, total amount due, make a payment, and total account balance (any activity)

Offer Letter – complete the electronic signature or print and deliver to the Financial Aid Office

College Financing Plan – shopping sheet

Correspondence Option – you can choose to receive hard copies of Financial Aid correspondence

Outside Awards – you can report new or view existing awards received from outside sources

Required Financial Aid Documents – list of missing documents. Submit before their due date to make sure your Financial Aid package is not delayed

Satisfactory Academic Progress – you can view your SAP for an evaluation period

Your Awards – you can accept or decline awards and update your loan amounts

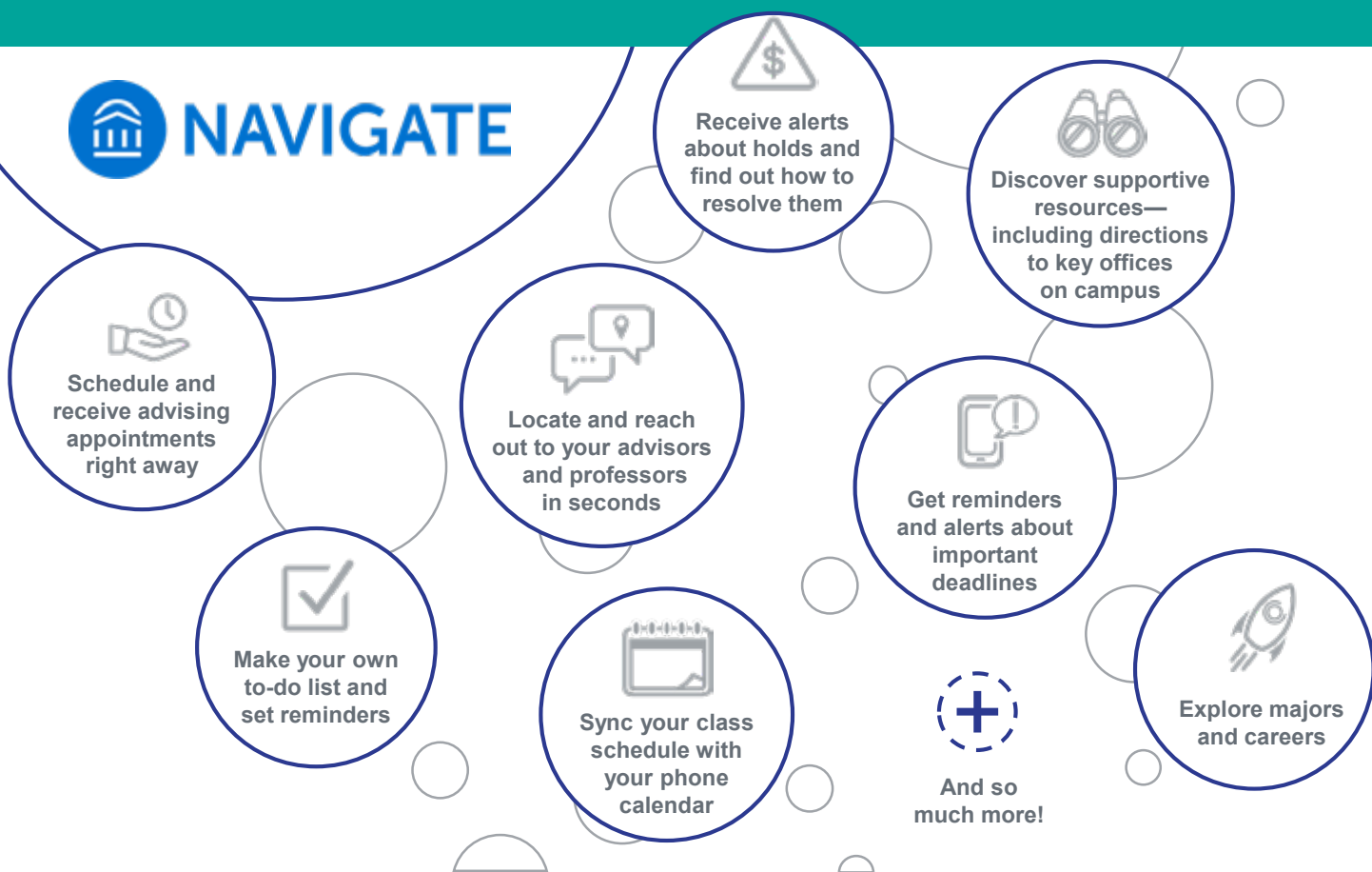

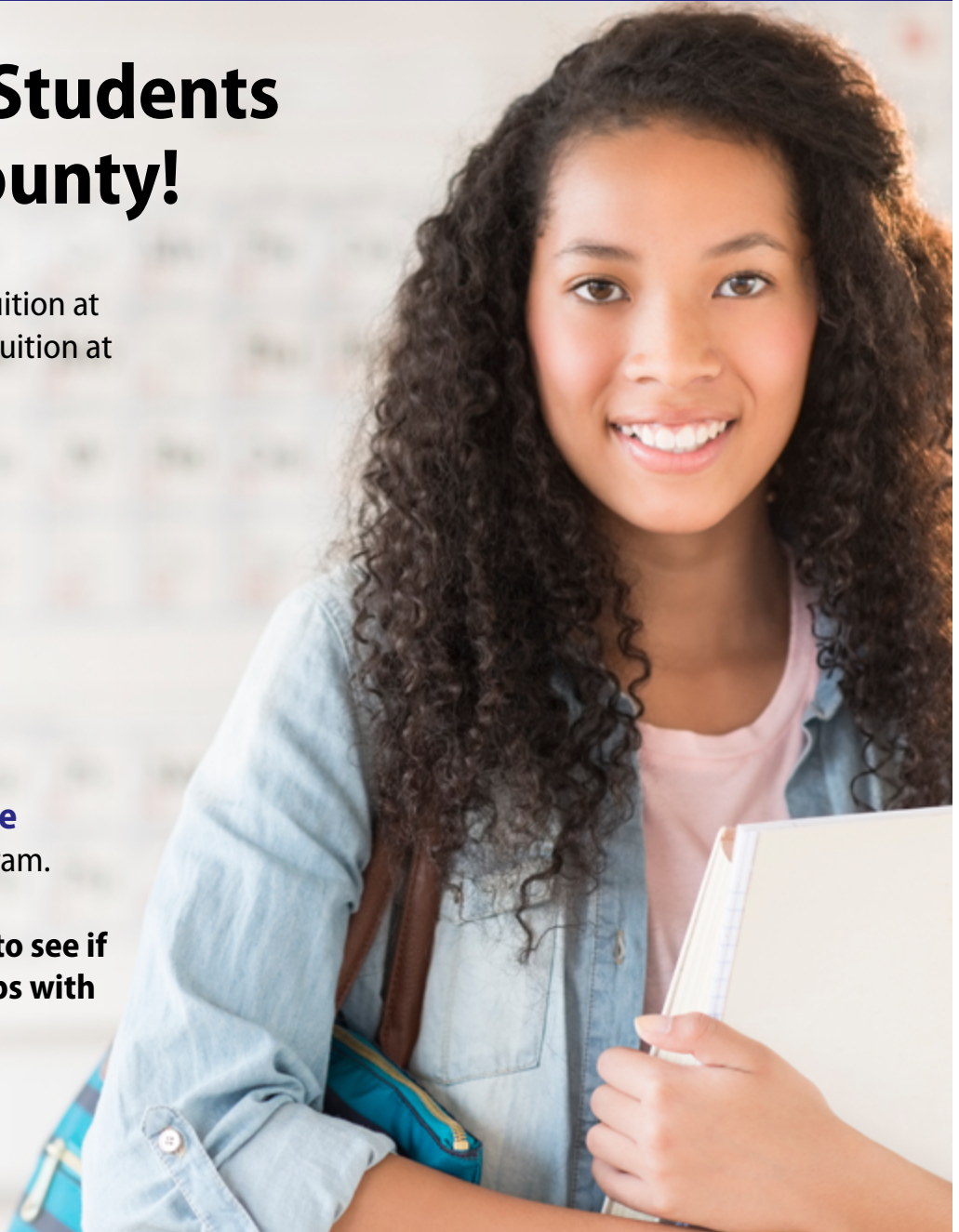
