



Project Description

The **Minority Film Festival**, scheduled for September 2024, is a key event celebrating Hispanic Heritage Month. This festival aims to highlight the cinematic talents of minority filmmakers and provide a platform for their unique voices. The event will feature film submissions from across the nation, with winning entries screened at Hudson County Community College (Jersey City) and other venues in New Jersey.

Timeline

- August 5: Opening of online submissions for short films, mid-length films, and documentaries.
- **September 5:** Submission deadline.
- September 5 15: Jury deliberation and review period.
- September 18: Announcement of pre-selected films.
- **September 22 27:** Opening Festival week with screenings and events.
- **September 27:** Closing Awards ceremony.

Festival Week Schedule (September 22 - 27)

- Opening Ceremony: Screening of the "Second Chances Cycle" short films, including "De las Cenizas a la Cima" and "Más Allá de la Condena."
- Screenings: Top pre-selected short films, mid-length films, and documentaries.
- Panel Discussions: Featuring filmmakers and industry experts.
- Awards Ceremony: Recognizing the best films and filmmakers.
- Closing Event: Networking and celebration.

Objectives

- 1. **Promote Cinematic Talent:** Offer a platform for minority filmmakers to showcase their work, gaining visibility and recognition.
- 2. **Cultural Celebration:** Celebrate Hispanic Heritage Month by highlighting stories and perspectives from Hispanic communities.
- 3. **Networking and Exposure:** Provide opportunities for filmmakers to network with industry professionals, potentially opening doors for future projects.
- 4. **Community Engagement:** Engage local communities in NJ through the art of filmmaking, fostering a sense of pride and cultural appreciation.




FROM SLAVERY TO FREEDOM
