**T**o help fulfill Hudson County Community College's (HCCC) mission and values, the HCCC Foundation works to serve the needs of students, faculty, staff, and the greater community. HCCC strives to build, cultivate, and maintain a culture of philanthropy.

Forging connections with both public and private donors, the HCCC Foundation exists to secure the resources that support essential programs and services to fuel Hudson County Community College's growth as it progresses toward its ambitious vision for the future.

HCCC's 2022-2023 accomplishments include: the Hudson Scholars Program winning the National Bellwether Award for Instructional Programs and Services; a College record six HCCC students named semifinalists for the prestigious Jack Kent Cooke Undergraduate Transfer Scholarship; and a college record of over 1,500 students receiving their diplomas in May 2023. The College offered programs in Culinary Arts, Computer Basics, Welding, and Phlebotomy to justice-involved individuals, giving them the credentialed skills and training they need to join the workforce.

But we have even bigger plans for the future as we work to bring additional educational opportunities and greater upward mobility to Hudson County residents. Our new Center for Student Success, which broke ground in June 2024, will enable us to serve more students than ever before and create a central, vertical, technologically advanced urban campus in the heart of Jersey City's Journal Square neighborhood, which is undergoing a renaissance. The College is expanding its Hudson Scholars program to bolster student success, we are steadily launching new online programs to meet students where they are, we are expanding our work with justice-involved individuals, and we are creating a genuinely inclusive and welcoming environment where all students can feel like "Hudson is Home."

Through a multifaceted approach, the HCCC Foundation strives to unlock a better and brighter future for HCCC students by providing financial support to open a world full of choices and possibilities for them thanks to your gifts.

# A YEAR OF FUNDRAISING AND FUN EVENTS

Throughout the year, the HCCC Foundation hosts several highly-anticipated, well-received events that generate significant revenue for the College.



## Golf Outing

The Foundation's annual golf outing has become a summertime hit over the years. The 20th annual Golf Outing took place on July 19 at the picturesque and exclusive Forest Hill Field Club in Bloomfield, NJ. The Student Golf Clinic allowed a number of HCCC students to learn the sport and play golf for the first time, providing them with invaluable networking skills and cultural capital for the future. Over 125 golfers attended, and the newly established Student Golf Clinic included 18 HCCC students. The fundraiser generated \$60,888 in net revenue.



## Night at the Races

On September 16, 2022, 60 attendees joined us for the HCCC Foundation Night at the Races at Meadowlands Racing and Entertainment. The fundraiser produced \$10,952 in net revenue.



## Foundation Gala

The HCCC Foundation's 25th Anniversary Gala on December 8, 2022 was a major success. The Gala raised over \$655,000 in contributions and launched the Hudson Scholars Program Endowment. At the event, the Ellucian Foundation established the Hudson Scholars Program and endowment through a \$50,000 leadership gift, the most significant gift made by a Gala honoree in the College's history. Several donors established and contributed to endowments with gifts ranging from \$25,000 to \$50,000 and over a dozen more made gifts of \$10,000 or above. Meanwhile, the Foundation Art Collection curated three art galleries for the Gala.



## Subscription Dining Series

Held over the course of 16 Fridays in both the Fall and Spring, the Subscription Dining Series allows donors to savor expertly crafted cuisine prepared and served by students in our nationally-ranked culinary program with friends and colleagues. All proceeds go toward tuition, book, and knife scholarships for deserving students College-wide. Not only that, but the series also helps culinary students graduate as it gives them a chance to perfect and showcase their front- and back-of-the-house skills with patrons and accumulate the hours needed to complete their required externships.



## Donor Scholar Reception

The Donor Scholar Reception honors both donors and scholars with a night of festivities. The Foundation awarded \$146,008 in student scholarships and this event provides donors the chance to meet the scholars who benefit from their donations, witnessing the real-life impact of their contributions firsthand. Scholars share their powerful stories with donors and family members and talk about what it took to get to where they are today. Scholars and their families get to witness and gain an understanding of how their education is being made possible by the generosity of donors, helping to inspire them to give back when they become alumni.

## West Hudson Committee Events

Since its inception, the West Hudson Committee has raised monies from numerous events each year to provide scholarships to HCCC students from Kearny, Harrison, and East Newark municipalities. The West Hudson Committee has a longstanding and proud tradition of supporting students from these Hudson County municipalities. It held successful events throughout the year including its Spring Fling event and its Wine & Cheese fundraiser.



## FOUNDATION ART COLLECTION

The Foundation Art Collection evolved from just 25 installed works to a burgeoning collection of over 1,955 works in less than 14 years.

The Foundation Art Collection features extensive collections of works by African-American artists and art about the African diaspora, Asian and Asian-American artists including large numbers of pieces by Japanese and Filipino artists, and Hispanic and Hispanic-American artists. There is also a strong focus on the work of artists from our home state of New Jersey like Willie Cole, Jon Rappleye, Chakaia Booker and others.

Unlike many college collections, the HCCC Foundation Art Collection isn't under lock and key, inaccessible to the community. Under the leadership of long-time coordinator Dr. Andrea Siegel, the entire Hudson County Community College campus has evolved into a living art museum, fulfilling a goal dear to the heart of former HCCC President Dr. Glen Gabert. The stewardship and growth of the collection endures today thanks to the support of current HCCC President, Dr. Christopher Reber, a strong advocate for the arts. Students walk through a curated collection of pieces by renowned artists on their way to class each and every day.


Studies show that art makes the greatest impact in places where economic inequality is the highest. Hudson County Community College serves more at-risk students than any other community college in New Jersey. Two-thirds to three-quarters of HCCC students report facing issues such as food insecurity, housing insecurity, and even homelessness. In this sense, the art collection is well-placed to significantly impact the lives of students who stand to gain the most from exposure to it.

During Fiscal 2023, the Foundation Art Collection continued to raise the quality of the educational art museum, by facilitating the donation of 64 works of fine art, including 34 artworks from a major corporation.


As part of ongoing outreach to the community, the Foundation Art Collection's coordinator gave monthly tours to community members who are interested in HCCC and its art program. The Foundation Art Collection also hosted a well-attended meet-the-artist event with 98-year-old renowned social justice artist, Henrietta Mantooth, who discussed her Jail Birds installation donation. Students sat with the artist and discussed their work and plans with her, while she provided support and mentoring career advice.

# CREATING ACTIVELY MANAGED ENDOWMENTS

HCCC's first ever series of thirteen new endowments were established and are being actively managed. An endowment is a permanent fund invested to generate future income in perpetuity. The principle is preserved over time while the income generated supports the College and its students. Endowments are privately established and held funds, therefore no matter the support HCCC receives from public and government entities, the scholarships these endowed funds provide will never be affected. We thank those who have generously established and contributed to the endowments listed below.

The thirteen endowments were not utilized during fiscal year 2023 to provide student scholarships as it is best practice for the principle funds to generate an initial income for one year. We look forward to providing innumerable scholarships from the endowments for the first time this upcoming 2024-2025 academic year.

## Here is a sample:

- **Dr. Christopher M. Reber Endowment** – Established by HCCC President Dr. Christopher M. Reber, this endowment supports scholarships for all students, including DACA, undocumented, and international students.
- **Christ Hospital Foundation** – This charitable grant supports scholarships for students in the Medical Assistant Program, Licensed Practical Nurse Program, Paramedic Science Program, and Respiratory Therapy Assistant Program.
- **Eric and Irene Groething Scholarship** – The College's photographer for almost 20 years, raised in Jersey City, established this scholarship in honor of his loving parents, Eric and Irene Groething. This endowment will provide scholarships for students in financial need for years to come.
- **Follett Higher Education** – This endowment provides textbook scholarships for HCCC students each year.
- **Hudson Cradle Endowment Fund** – This fund provides scholarships for single parents from Hudson County so that they can pursue their education at HCCC.
- **Hudson Scholars Program Endowment** - This endowment ensures that future generations of HCCC students can continue to benefit from Hudson Scholars by scaling and sustaining the program and its outcomes. The Hudson Scholars Program offers a broad range of one-on-one support to aid students in their transition to college and life at HCCC, which promotes student persistence and success.

- **Independence Community Foundation** – This fund provides scholarships to HCCC students that are enrolled in the Fine Arts Program, in-county residents, and in good academic standing.
- **Javedd Khan Essay Prize**- Prizes are awarded in memory of Professor Javedd Khan, who for many years was a beloved teacher of writing, humanities, and moral issues at HCCC. The scholarship is awarded to students who demonstrate qualities Professor Khan admired, encouraged and developed in his students: commitment to hard work in their own advancement, and a desire to engage as intelligent, well-informed adults with the world around them.
- **Leadership Legacy Foundation (Gloria Esposito)** – This endowment honors the legacy of Gloria Esposito, a graduate of Ferris High School in Jersey City and a strong advocate for education, especially for young women. Mrs. Esposito was a pillar of the Jersey City community, serving many through her employment agency, and Gloria Esposito Plaza in Journal Square is named in her honor. This scholarship helps female students from Ferris High School who demonstrate leadership skills and are involved in community service and extracurricular activities.
- **Paul Dillon Endowed Fund** –An endowed fund in memory of Paul Dillon supporting HCCC Culinary students. Dillon was the longest-serving Director/Associate Dean of the Culinary Arts Institute (CAI) (2007-2021, with Culinary/Baking/Hospitality), later taking on Business, Accounting, and Supply Chain Management, among many other initiatives. Paul was instrumental in the success of the Foundation Gala and the Foundation Dining Series. He hosted “Let’s Cook,” which ran for many seasons on Comcast Channel 8 and brought considerable visibility to the culinary program and to the College.
- **Pioneer Mens & Boys Club** – The Pioneer Mens and Boys Club has been a longtime partner of the HCCC Foundation, and this endowment supports scholarships for full-time HCCC students that are in-county residents, demonstrate financial need, and are in good academic standing.
- **Richard J. McCormack Scholarship** – Established by Foundation Chair Monica McCormack-Casey and her family, this scholarship honors her late brother, Richard J. McCormack, a Jersey City native who displayed a lifelong passion and enthusiasm for this community. This scholarship supports students from Jersey City who are in financial need and balancing school and work.
- **West Hudson Scholarship Fund** - This scholarship supports HCCC students from Kearny, Harrison, and East Newark public high schools.

# FINANCIAL MANAGEMENT TRANSPARENCY

The HCCC Foundation finished fiscal 2023 with \$2.24 million in total assets, a significant 24% year-over-year increase from 2022's \$1.80 million in total assets. This increase in assets will empower us to help more HCCC students than ever before.

Major changes to our Fiscal Management, including hiring a Foundation Bookkeeper, a money manager, and a complete reorganization of our investment strategy, have led to higher revenue.


Fiscal 2023 was a year of tremendous growth and progress for advancement and for the HCCC Foundation, and none of this would have been possible without the generosity and dedication of our donors and the Foundation Board. We received a record \$767,037 in donations and event revenue (up from \$531,646 in 2022), which helps build a foundation for further growth in the years ahead.

Taking advantage of high interest rates, our funds are growing. We've contracted with PNC Investments to professionally manage our assets, and made it easier for people to donate online. These changes have contributed to our new, solid financial structure to ensure maximum donor ease and maximum effectiveness of our fundraising efforts.


In all, 91% of HCCC Foundation's donations go towards program expenses such as scholarships and the art collection while just 9% go towards general expenses.


### USE OF DONATIONS




The HCCC Foundation is a good steward of funds, as the overwhelming majority of donations go towards student scholarships and bookstore stipends (nearly 70% combined). During the 2022-2023 fiscal year, we awarded \$186,000 in scholarships (including book stipends) to 78 deserving students. Meanwhile, an additional 19% goes towards costs related to maintaining and expanding the Foundation Art Collection. The HCCC Foundation provides up to ten (10) \$2,000 stipends to distribute to students who complete two-month summer internships with local companies or organizations partnered with the College in a field in which compensation is not usually provided.


