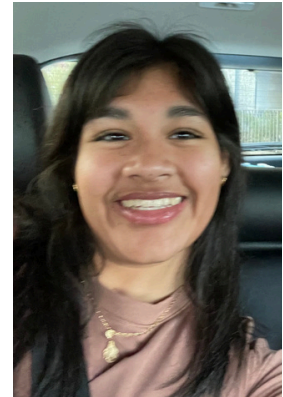

For this issue of the Pathway Press, Career and Transfer Pathways has the pleasure of introducing one of our esteemed employer partners—Go Foundation.

Their Mission:

Go Foundation's mission is ultimately to provide students with access to quality education through high-dosage tutoring. They envision an America where every child has the support of a tutor to enable them to realize their full human potential. Go Foundation's target audience is students considering taking a gap after finishing community college or before transferring to a four-year university to serve as a tutor and mentor. Their program is nine hours a day, Monday- Friday. If selected, fellows will be expected to assist lead teachers in classrooms, and the Go fellows' primary responsibility will be leading and supporting small group dosage tutorial sessions in English language arts and Math.

Go Foundation offers after-school programming in addition to tutorial sessions for math and English. Go Foundation provides Early intervention to aid students in k-12 settings. Go fellows will also be expected to support extracurricular endeavors as mentors to students involved in clubs and sports teams—some mentors facilitate anime clubs, step teams, sports teams, and so much more. Each school's club offerings may differ, but the premise is the same—Go fellows will serve as role models and lead extra-curricular activities after school.

Highlights

The program is based on national service. It is a great way for those interested in obtaining transferable skills and hands-on experience in the classroom. It is open to all majors. If you are looking to take a gap year before finishing your degree or going into the professional field right away, it is a valuable entryway to give back to the community. Go Fellows typically end up pursuing further education and roles in social work, education, psychology and sociology.

OUR OFFICE PROVIDES A RANGE OF SUPPORT SERVICES TO HELP STUDENTS WITH CAREER READINESS AND JOB/INTERNSHIP SEARCH. THESE SERVICES ARE OFTEN OFFERED BY EDUCATIONAL INSTITUTIONS, PROFESSIONAL ORGANIZATIONS, AND CAREER COUNSELORS/COACHES.

| <p>Early Stages (0-15 credits):</p> | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Research: Start researching potential transfer universities and their transfer requirements, including GPA, prerequisite courses, and application deadlines. Consider factors such as location, program offerings, and financial aid options. • Academic Advising: Meet with an academic advisor at the college to discuss your transfer goals. They can guide you on the appropriate courses to take and ensure you are on track to meet transfer requirements. • General Education Courses: Focus on completing your general education requirements, as these are typically transferable to most universities. Additionally, reach out to your community college's career services department for guidance on how your academic choices align with your long-term career goals. They can provide insights into which universities offer programs that best match your desired career path. • Major Exploration: If you have an idea of your intended major, start exploring the prerequisite courses required by your target universities. Ensure that you are taking the necessary courses at your community college. • Maintain GPA: Aim to maintain a competitive GPA, as many universities have minimum GPA requirements for transfer students. Strive for a GPA above the minimum requirement to enhance your chances of acceptance. |
| <p>Preparing for Transfer (30-45 credits):</p> | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Transfer Agreements: Check if your community college has any transfer agreements or articulation agreements with specific universities. These agreements outline the courses that will transfer and fulfill major requirements at the receiving institution. • Visit Transfer Offices: Visit the Transfer Pathways office at the college and the universities you are interested in to seek guidance and ensure you are on track. They can provide information on transfer scholarships, housing options, and other resources. Additionally, check in with your academic advisor during this stage to discuss your progress, ensure you're meeting the necessary academic requirements, and get their input on your transfer plans. • Extracurricular Activities: Engage in extracurricular activities, such as clubs or volunteer work, to enhance your transfer application. These activities demonstrate your involvement and commitment outside of academics. |
| <p>Application and Final Stages (45-60 credits):</p> | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Application Deadlines: Be aware of transfer application deadlines for your target universities. Start working on your application well in advance to ensure you have enough time to gather necessary documents, such as transcripts and recommendation letters. • Personal Statement: Begin drafting your personal statement, highlighting your academic achievements, extracurricular activities, and reasons for transferring. Seek feedback from advisors, professors, or mentors to strengthen your statement. • Financial Aid: Research and apply for financial aid and scholarships specific to transfer students. Contact the financial aid offices at both your community college and the transfer universities to explore your options. • Check with Registrar Office regarding Graduation: As you approach the completion of your community college coursework, check with the Registrar's Office to ensure you are on track for graduation. They can provide guidance on any final requirements and procedures. What motivated you to transfer to your current college/university?

Despite the challenges of balancing school, work, and a personal life I was ready to take on the challenge of ensuring I complete my goal of further and completing my education beyond a two-year institution. HCCC, my friends and family all gave me the support and resources I need to make it possible. I can now proudly say that I successfully completed my goal and now hold three degrees, one from HCCC and two from SPU.

What resources or support systems were most helpful during your transfer process?

I want to point out the EOF program, the experience from the start of the summer academy leading up to graduation day has been a supportive and life changing experience. The resources, community, and network of the EOF family has played a pivotal role in the transfer process especially since there are EOF programs throughout two year and four-year institutions within the state of New Jersey. The family dynamic that EOF exuberates bridges the transition from a two-year institution to a four year seamlessly. The mission and goal of the EOF program is to support and aid first generation students to successfully complete their educational journey and assist in transitioning into the work force.

Can you describe any challenges you faced when transferring and how you overcame them?

As a graduate of the Class of 2020 the global pandemic surely impacted me, and many others transition to a four-year institution. The fear of the unknown and trying to balance life and continuing studies proved to be the ultimate challenge. Nonetheless, with the support of the EOF family, friends, and relatives I was able to preserve through finishing my undergraduate journey.

What motivated you to pursue your chosen career path?

I have always displayed a strong interest in healthcare, my passion for caring for others and wanting to be a leader for change has been at the forefront of my desire to pursue a career in healthcare. Prior to starting college, I was a caretaker for my aunt's elderly parents, from that moment I knew I developed a strong interest for wanting to help others and become a changing agent for the community in providing the best overall quality of care.

How did transferring affect your career goals or opportunities?

Transitioning from a community college to a four-year institution was an eye-opening experience. The family and community dynamic within HCCC in comparison to SPU was quite different given the presence of the ongoing global pandemic and the decline for student involvement throughout campus.

How did the career services at HCCC and your new college/university help you in your job search?

Having access to the career services at both HCCC and SPU has been a fantastic resource especially since navigating the work force can be very daunting and challenging.
