HELPS ELIGIBLE LOW-INCOME HOUSEHOLDS PAY FOR INTERNET SERVICE DURING THE COVID-19 PANDEMIC

You are eligible if any member of your household:

- **Gets one of these:**
 - Medicaid
 - Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP),
 - Supplemental Security Income (SSI),
 - Federal Public Housing Assistance (Section 8),
 - Veterans' Pension and Survivors' Benefit,
 - Lifeline
 - Tribal Programs **OR**
 - If your income is 135% less than the Federal Poverty Level
- **Received a Pell Grant during the current award year,**
- **Experienced a significant loss of income since Feb. 29, 2020, **OR****
- **Meets the criteria for a participating provider's existing low-income or COVID-19 program.**

If eligible, the program pays for:

- Up to \$50/month for an eligible broadband service
(up to \$75/month for households on qualifying Tribal lands)
- Up to \$100 to purchase a device from participating providers (onetime discount)
- Only one monthly service discount and one device discount is allowed per household.
To receive the connected device discount, consumers need to enroll in the EBB Program with a participating provider that offers connected devices (not all service providers offer device discounts). The service provider will provide the discount to the consumer.
