## Hudson County Community College HEERF Student Funds Quarterly Reporting

Report on the Use of Funds Distributed to HCCC from the Higher Education Emergency Relief Fund

Reporting Date: March 31, 2022

The U.S. Department of Education published a Notice of Public Posting Requirement of Grant Information for Higher Education Emergency Relief Fund (HEERF) Grantees on August 31, 2020, directing universities to report quarterly on the receipt and use of funds received from the HEERF established by the Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security Act (CARES Act). The following report contains the information listed in the Department of Education's notice.

- 1. HCCC signed and submitted the Funding Certification and Agreement for Emergency Financial Aid Grants to Students under the CARES Act to the Department of Education on April 22, 2020. HCCC signed and submitted the Funding Certification and Agreement for the Institutional Portion of the Higher Education Emergency Relief Fund Formula Grants Authorized by Section 18004(a)(1) of the CARES Act to the Department of Education on April 22, 2020. As per the Certification and Agreement, HCCC has used or intends to use the applicable amount of funds designated under the CRRSAA and ARP (a)(1) and (a)(4) programs to provide Emergency Financial Aid Grants to Students.
- 2. As of the reporting date of March 31, 2022, HCCC has received from the Department pursuant to the institution's Certification of Agreement for Financial Aid Grants to Students under the CRRSAA and ARP (a)(1) and (a)(4) programs the total emergency fund amount of \$19,258,184.00
- 3. The total amount of Emergency Financial Aid Grants distributed to students under the CRRSSA and ARP (a)(1) and (a)(4) programs is \$18,335.805.
- 4. The estimated total number of students at the institution that is eligible to receive Emergency Financial Aid Grants to Students under the CRRSAA and ARP (a)(1) and (a)(4) programs is 11,000.
- 5. The total number of students who have received Emergency Financial Aid Grants to students under the CRRSAA and ARP (a)(1) and (a)(4) programs is 7,392.
- 6. HCCC asked eligible students to complete an application for COVID-19 emergency assistance to determine which students received Emergency Financial Aid Grants. The application identified categories of qualified expenses, such as food, housing, technology, transportation, childcare, and medical expenses. The college has awarded eligible students the CARES Act emergency fund amount of \$750.00 and can receive additional funding as per the student's request, supported by documentation and an explanation.
