



Joint Admissions Agreement

Between

Kean University and Hudson County Community College

The Joint Admission Agreement ("Agreement") is entered into as of 1st day of March, 2018 ("Effective Date") by and between Kean University, 1000 Morris Avenue, Union, New Jersey 07083 ("Kean University"), and Hudson County Community College, 70 Sip Avenue, Jersey City, NJ 07306 ("College"). College and Kean University are each referred to herein as "Party" individually and "Parties" collectively.

WHEREAS, Kean University and College seek to develop collaborative endeavors built on the strengths and capacities of both institutions for the education of their students; and

WHEREAS, it is the goal of Kean University and College to provide a seamless transition for College students who successfully complete an associate degree at College, (the" Students"), to an agreed upon academic program at Kean University.

NOW THEREFORE, Kean University and College mutually agree as follows:

1. OPERATING PROCEDURES FOR ENROLLMENT IN THE JOINT ADMISSIONS PROGRAM

- 1.1 Through the Joint Admissions Program Students will be provisionally admitted to Kean University. Upon successfully completing their associates degree Students may gain full admissions to Kean University. Students will allow College to release their official transcripts and other relevant information to Kean University by signing the Release Form attached as Exhibit A before and after the completion of their associate degrees. Kean University will determine admission standards for all Students who shall be enrolling into Kean University's academic programs.
- 1.2 The College will add Kean University's name on its admissions application so that new students can indicate their interest in enrolling at Kean University upon entry to

the College.

- 1.3 The application fee shall be waived for Students applying to Kean University through this Agreement.
- 1.4 Kean University will accept jointly admitted Students upon satisfactory completion of their associate degree at College without further admission review, provided students have met the applicable admission requirements of Kean University and the agreed upon undergraduate programs, including meeting the minimum Grade Point Average (GPA) at all post-secondary institutions attended.
- 1.5 Kean University will allow students who successfully complete the appropriate or corresponding associate degree at College to transfer credits upon their admission to an agreed upon undergraduate programs offered at Kean University. The number of credits transferred will be based upon the equivalency of courses pursuant to Exhibit A attached hereto and amended from time to time upon Kean University's discretion. The transfer of credits awarded by Kean University to a Student shall be pursuant to State legislation and/or corresponding statewide transfer agreements, not exceeding fifty (50) percent of the baccalaureate requirements. The transfer of courses shall also be subject to the requirements of the Kean University catalog, including the minimum grade requirement for all transfer courses. Kean University will honor the same equivalency for courses taken at another institution and applied to the associate degree requirements. All other courses taken at an institution other than College will be evaluated on a course-by-course basis. Students shall be given a full junior status upon transferring to Kean University.
- 1.6 Students nearing completion of the associate degree may receive permission to enroll concurrently at College and Kean University and be eligible for reverse transfer to complete outstanding associate degree requirements.
- 1.7 Tuition and fees for Kean University courses shall be established and collected by Kean University.

2. COMMUNICATION

- 2.1 Kean University and College shall have joint responsibility for identifying and communicating to each other changes in the policies or requirements of their respective institutions that affect this Agreement. The Parties shall provide written notice to each other of any curricular changes that impact the articulated programs as soon as the changes are approved institutionally.
- 2.2 The Parties agree to review the Agreement once every three (3) years to update course offerings and adjust the terms of the Agreement as needed.
- 2.3 Both Parties will designate individuals to serve as liaisons for the administration of this Agreement. Kean University will establish an operational procedure for conducting ongoing communication strategies with College and its students.

3. ADVISING AND COMMUNICATING WITH STUDENTS

- 3.1 Program advising materials listing courses to be completed at the College and subsequently at Kean University will be available and will be distributed appropriately to designated advisors. The program articulation agreements between the two institutions will provide course and major requirements used as the basis for student advising prior to and after admission to Kean University.
- 3.2 Each campus will identify the individuals responsible for administration and program advising.
- 3.3 Kean University will provide advising/registration/enrollment information sessions for the College students.

4. PUBLICITY

Both Parties will coordinate with their relevant departments to conduct publicity of the joint admission collaboration.

5. TERM

- 5.1 This Agreement shall commence on the Effective Date mentioned above. Either party has the right to terminate this Agreement on thirty (30) days prior written notice to the other party. In the event of a breach of any provision of this Agreement by one party, the other party shall have the right and option to give the breaching party written notice. In the event that the breaching party fails to remedy the breach within thirty (30) days of the receipt of such written notice, the other party may, at its sole option, terminate this Agreement.
- 5.2 Kean University reserves the right to discontinue admission to academic programs if enrollment at Kean University is insufficient to justify continuation of the academic program. Students in those programs will be afforded a timeline to complete the degree requirements.

6. INDEPENDENT CONTRACTOR

Both Kean University and the College are independent contractors. It is not intended that an employer/employee, joint venture, or partnership agreement be established hereby expressly or by implication between Kean University and the College. Rather, in discharging all duties and obligations hereunder, Kean University shall at all times be in and remain in an independent contractor relationship with the College.

7. REGULATORY COMPLIANCE

Kean University and College agree that each shall comply with all applicable

requirements of municipal, county, state, and federal authorities, statutes and regulations now or hereafter in force and effect to the extent that they directly or indirectly bear upon the subject matter of this Agreement.

8. ASSIGNMENT

Neither party may assign or delegate this Agreement or any interest herein or responsibility hereunder without the prior written consent of the other party.

9. SEVERABILITY

If any provision of this Agreement is, as a matter of law, unenforceable, then such provision shall be deemed to be deleted and this Agreement shall otherwise remain in full force and effect.

10. GOVERNING LAW

This Agreement shall be governed by and construed in accordance with the laws of the State of New Jersey, including without limitation, the New Jersey Tort Claims Act, N.J.S.A. 59:1-1 et seq., and the New Jersey Contractual Liability Act, N.J.S.A. 59:13-1 et seq.

11. NOTICES

All notices required or permitted under this Agreement shall be in writing and shall be delivered in person, through email, or deposited in the United States mail, postage prepaid, addressed as follows:
