

The college offers free tutoring, so I go to the Tutoring Center.





People can find every piece of information from the Internet's news easily because Internet is a "huge space", which can keep a lot of information for a long time. Hence, finding the news or information from twenty or thirty years ago is very easy and convenient. People, moreover, can find every piece of information which they need from the Inter-

net's newspapers quickly and precisely. For example, with college students, finding information to support for their work and their projects is very important, so news from the Internet is a "best friend" for them. This is because it will take them a lot of time if they look up the information book by book, or traditional newspaper by newspaper. In contrast, with Internet's news, they just need to type what they want to find, it will give the information for them exactly and some information which relates to their information.

Furthermore, the Internet's news can be read anywhere and anytime because people just use their phones or their laptops which connect to the Internet to read the news. Otherwise, it is hard for people, especially students to find the information from the traditional newspapers.

For example, when students want to find an event which happened twenty years ago, they have to search in a lot of newspapers, as well as traditional magazines. It can take them many hours, even many days to find the information.



Besides, when people want to read a newspaper or magazine, they have to bring it with them.

As a result, that will make their baggage become heavier. Therefore, using Internet's news is more convenient to find the information than traditional newspapers.

Another difference between news from the Internet and traditional newspapers is saving resources. Using news from the Internet does not require any books or folders to keep the information. Users just need to use their phone or their computer to go to the Internet and read their news. Moreover, when they don't need this news or this information anymore, they can delete it with a simple step. In contrast, traditional newspapers require the use of lots of papers to keep the information, words. When users don't want this information, they have to throw their books, their newspapers, and their magazines away. People have to put them in a recycling bin to re-use them, and people have to pay the money for this recycling. In addition, users have to spend a lot of money on buying newspapers and books while the news from the Internet is free. With students, books are one of the reasons that make them have to pay a lot. In Vietnam, everyone has to pay more than "500.000 VND" for daily newspapers every month. The price of books for student is very high, especially the books from other countries. Therefore, buying books for children to go to school always makes parents spend a lot of money. Moreover, keeping books, magazines, and newspapers requires humans to keep a space to keep them. That will be inconvenient for any house which has a narrow space. In contrast, the Internet's news doesn't need too much space to keep them because people just need a small microchip or an USB to keep them. News from the Internet helps humans save a lot of space, money, and resources while traditional newspapers occupy a lot of space and are expensive.

The final difference between news from the Internet and traditional newspapers is the effect on humans' eyes. Using the news from the Internet will make humans' eyes work too hard, and they have to look at the screen for a long time. That will damage and bring a lot of negative effects to their eyes, as well as their health. However, when people read traditional books with the distance from their eyes to the book are acceptable, that will not cause any damage to their eyes or their health.

For example, in Vietnam, there are a lot of children in the city who have problems with their eyes because they often use the Internet, online books, and Internet's news. In contrast, the countryside does not have many computers, as well as Internet machines, so the children who have problems with their eyes are fewer than children in the city. They have to study with traditional books, and do not have too many chances to read books or news from the Internet. To sum it up, although there are a lot of differences between news from the Internet and traditional newspapers, both of them provide the information for humans and make their lives become more convenient and better. Internet's news is more convenient for people, and helps them save a lot of money or space, but that is not good for humans' eyes. Although Internet's news has become more popular in today's life, there are a lot of people who are likely to use traditional newspapers. In my opinion, Internet's news is very useful for humans, especially students, but everyone should control their usage to avoid negative effects to their eyes.



The human ability to learn and to understand the outside and inside universe is based on their own intelligences. However, Humans are not limited by only one type of intelligence. Interpersonal: 15
Intrapersonal: 14
Visual/spatial: 12

Interpersonal intelligence: The best recommendation for interpersonal

intelligence is to find or create groups of people to communicate and exchange ideas with. Debates can be very helpful in the learning process of a person who has interpersonal intelligence. In my case, I feel extremely comfortable when I am interacting with large groups. For instance, when I study something, I'm able to come up with a variety of ideas. However, after a debate with more people, I can realize perspectives which I was not aware of when studying only by myself.

Teaching what I learned is the most powerful interpersonal skill I have. Once I learn anything that I feel is interesting, important or helpful, I have an almost uncontrollable feeling that forces me to explain it in an easier way to other people, and this definitely not only helps the person who is learning from my explanation, but I also learn even more from myself.

Intrapersonal intelligence: Before you start studying, stop and meditate. For people who have intrapersonal intelligence, it's easier to learn from his or her own personal study. This is one reason that I found doing meditation to be extremely helpful before studying. In this way, I can achieve a more reflective state of mind, which increases my chances of learning and understanding new information. I also become calmer and my anxiety or pressure of what has to be studied decreases.

The place must be isolated. Places that have minimal noises are perfect to study and amplify people's concentration. In my personal case, I love to isolate myself for hours because I find focusing easier and also when it is combined with a previous meditation, the learning process is twice as good.

Visual/Spatial intelligence: If you have visual intelligence you may want to draw images to express the main idea of a text. I have the ability to draw, and this can be a helpful tool in order to save time. Instead of *re-reading* every paragraph, I just need to look at the picture and I will be able to retrieve most of the information within the paragraph.

Creating mental pictures increases the chances of understanding any kind of information. When those who have visual intelligence create images in their minds whether in class or even in a normal conversation, it may increase the understanding and comprehension of ideas. In my personal case, I have tried to do this a couple of times and I felt it extremely useful, even if the subject is more objective than subjective. For instance, when I am in class and the professor starts to explain a subject, I create pictures in my mind following the explanation, which makes it easier to remember the information or at least how it would look.

Monsters of Sexting

According to a survey made by the Psychology and Science magazine in the USA in 2013, between eight and ten percent of older teens send a nude photo or video of themselves, while older age groups tend to be involved in sexting at higher percentages. Since the Internet and global communication allow information to be widespread, this content might be dangerous. Sexting could lead to three major consequences such as causing social stigma, generating legal penalties, and producing psychological issues.

For one thing, because the information can remain online, people involved in sexting may deal with social prejudices. First, when a company wants to hire a new employee, it makes a research online. People's records can appear, even if the material was published a long time ago. Obviously, the company would not consider candidates with nude images, and they may have troubles to find a job. Second, due to the material with sexual content can spread and be viewed by anyone, people run the risk of losing scholarships, jobs, and being kicked out from sports teams. As a real-life example, the politician Anthony Weiner was involved in sexting scandals and had to resign his seat in Congress. Finally, social prejudices of sexting entail judgment. Indeed, family and friends may have a misconception and move away from people implicated. In short, social stigma that sexting brings is hard to face.

For another thing, sexting is a dangerous decision because of legal consequences. In fact, sexual photos, videos, and messages even when these are sent between minors, can be classified as child pornography. All who are involved, both the picture taker and the image recipient as anyone who disseminates the content, possibly will be accused and must confront legal penalties. Moreover, depending on the legal environment of each country, extra penalties can be a violation of reputation and privacy. For example, in 2012 in Spain, a man was accused and found guilty of

spreading images of a naked woman that he had gotten by accessing her webcam. Lastly, people can be charged with extortion and harassment. It is the case of a blackmailer who threatens to disseminate private images. Consequently, to distribute explicit sexual info can result in severe criminal consequences even jail.

Equal importantly, sexting causes psychological injury. First of all, once the information has been published, oppression and intimidation starts. People become a victim of bullying and suffer low self-esteem. In addition, other issues as depression and humiliation are inevitable. For example, a thirteen-year-old girl named Hope Wetzel in California could not bear the shame when her nude photos were shared by her classmates, so she committed suicide. Although some people try to justify sexting considering it as the ultimate form of safe sex, this is a life-threatening practice for all these critical effects. Society must do more to raise awareness of the dangers of sexting. Parents and teachers should speak with teenagers to alert them how harmful it could be, and adults should not jeopardize their status because of sexting.
