





I he author of The E Myth Revisited, Michael Gerber, starts of by stating that 80% of businesses fail within the first 5 years of it's existence. Throughout the book the author explains why most businesses do not work and what could be done about it.

The Entrepreneur myth is that most businesses are started by someone with great technical skills, but someone who also lacks business skills. Most new business owners assume that just because they know how to do the technical work that they also know how the business aspect works.

Michael Gerber emphasizes that a solution to this problem is that a new business owner plays 3 important roles -- entrepreneur, manager, and technician. The entrepreneur is the one that innovates that thinks ahead and plans the future of the business. The manager establishes order. The technician does the technical work required for the service or the product being sold.

For example, if Mark the Plumber wants to start his own plumbing business, he has to understand that besides plumbing, he also has to do marketing, finance, managing, innovating, and customer support. All those business owner tasks must be done, either by Mark or by someone helping him. A business can never grow if the business owner is only doing the technical work.

The author suggests that the business owner needs to setup their business in a way that the business keeps running if the business owner is not present. The book describes this as "Franchise Prototype". Most businesses that do succeed are franchises, because those businesses already have a manual with details on how everything should run. If you visit a Subway in Texas and then you visit a Subway in Mexico, you will have the same experience. In conclusion, the book suggests that every entrepreneur should setup their business like if it were going to be a franchise, and that current and future business owners should understand that a business can't grow if the business owner is only doing the technical work.

Snap Inc. goes public—controversy strikes

On March 2, 2017, the parent company of Snapchat, Snap Inc. went public, and now has shares available in the stock market. According to <u>investing.com</u>, Snap's IPO is a very big deal, it is the first major social media IPO since Twitter.

It is also a very controversial IPO. Many analyst and stakeholders are either in-favor or skeptical about Snapchat. Something that we have all learned from the past is that social media networks can be hot one day and



can be gone the next day.

Look at Myspace, MeerKat, and Vine for example. At one point all of these social media platforms were extremely popular and valuable, but they all disappeared either because of competition or lack of innovation.

Business Insider states that many experienced investors are skeptical about Snap's IPO because it is unprofitable, and actually losing money. Snap reported that in 2016 the company had a net loss of \$513.6 million, over 100 million more than in 2015. CEO Evan Spiegel also stated that Snap may not see any profits soon, as it continues to reinvest into the company. Spiegel also stated that Snap is not a social media company but it is a 'camera company'.

The elephant in the room that many people are disregarding is tech giant Facebook. Besides having their own social media platform, Facebook also owns two other big players, WhatsApp and Instagram.

When all combined, there are over 2 billion monthly active users on its platforms. Facebook recently updated Messenger, Whatsapp, and Instagram with "disappearing stories". A feature that was once unique and made Snapchat one of a kind,

Although there are many reasons to be concerned about the future of Snap, we have to look at the bright side, it is a young company with a lot of potential and great talent. It is the digital age, and that seems to mean that anything goes.






Why James Harden will win NBA MVP

Roughly 65 games into the NBA season, most of the conversation surrounding the race for league MVP revolves around Russell Westbrook of the Oklahoma City Thunder, and rightfully so.

Westbrook, who is on pace to be the first player to average a triple double for an entire NBA season since Oscar Robertson of the then Cincinnati Royals did in 1962, is performing on a once in a generation type statistical level that may in fact never be equaled. According to ESPN.com he is currently averaging 32.1 points, 10.5 rebounds

ready contains -- with all due respect to the defending champion Cleveland Cavaliers -the NBA's two best teams, the Golden State Warriors and the San Antonio Spurs.

Harden is enjoying a rebirth of sorts on the hardwood as well. His surprising move to a player from a championship contender. from shooting guard to point guard, preseason -- which was designed by first year coach Mike D'Antoni of spread pick-and-roll fame -- has been a wildly successful one. Playing Harden at point puts the ball in the hands of one of the NBA's most dominant scorers more often and allows "The Beard," who has an incredibly high basketball I.Q. to begin with, to control the flow of the game on a full -time basis.

The "triple-double" statistic has been a good way to measure players this season. According to SBnation.com, The NBA as a whole has 79 triple-doubles so far this year. This breaks the record of 78 which was set in 1988 and keep in mind that it is only March. Westbrook has a staggering 30 tripledoubles compared to 15 -- which just might lead the league in any other year -- for Harden. But Harden, has by far the most impressive one. On Jan 31, Harden notched a triple double against the New York Knicks where he was responsible for an unbelievable 95 points. According to CBSsports.com Harden scored 53 points, grabbed 16 rebounds and dished out 17 assists -- 8 of which were delivered to players who knocked down threepointers. This makes Harden's New Year's Eve performance the closest thing to Wilt Chamberlain's 100 points scored on March 2, 1962. Chamberlain, an NBA legend, and one of its 50 greatest players of all time was a 4

time league MVP and any comparisons to him must translate into consideration for this year's award for Harden.

It is hard to argue that any player in the NBA is more valuable to their team than James Harden and the award most often goes As every day passes the Houston Rockets look more and more like one of the NBA's best teams. The same cannot be said about the Oklahoma City Thunder and this is exactly why "The Beard" will end up stealing the hardware from Russ come June.



and 10 assists per game.

But, is history against Westbrook? No MVP winner has played on a sub 50-win team since Moses Malone (76ers) in 1982. And with the Thunder on pace to finish victorious less than 50 times ... Enter "The Beard."

James Harden, of the Houston Rockets, is quietly having possibly the most impressive season since Robertson as well. It just so happens that his 2017 NBA MVP campaign is coinciding with his former teammate Westbrook's monster year. According to ESPN.com Harden is averaging a hefty 29.1 points, 7.9 rebounds and a league leading 11.2 assists per game.

The catch here is that Harden and the Rockets are on pace for 55+ wins and are shaping up to be formidable contenders in the ever-stacked western conference which al-
