#### **MEET OUR STUDENTS**





#### **Mid Stages (15-29)**


Refine your goals, clarify your transfer or career path, build your resume, connect with Career and Transfer Pathways, and attend events that help you explore opportunities and plan your next steps.


## WHAT HAVE YOU GONE ON TO DO IN YOUR CAREER OR EDUCATION AFTER HCCC?


On October 9th, 2025, eleven students took part in a private tour of Rutgers Newark's School of Health Professions, organized by the *Career and Transfer Pathways*

# Career-Coded: 3 Part Workshop Series Recap

#### Overview:

This 3-part workshop series prepared students to translate their coding projects, classwork technical skills, and hands-on experience into a resume that gets noticed.

#### HACK YOUR CAREER

On October 30th, 10 students attended the first workshop led by Miguel Cruz, an HCCC Computer Science alumnus and a current NJIT student. Miguel engaged in a discussion on AI and invited students to share their perspectives on how AI might impact the future of their own career paths. He also highlighted essential programming languages and explored career paths. Miguel emphasized to his audience the importance of soft skills, networking, and becoming experts in their passions.

#### CODE & CONQUER

The second workshop was held on Nov. 6th. Students were introduced to Github, a platform where they can showcase their projects and coding solutions, and search for jobs or internships. The students were guided by Christian Liebl, the Administrative Support Specialist for the office of Academic Support Services. Students created their own GitHub accounts, shared their profiles and were able to connect with each other.
