What inspired you to pursue a career in Career and Transfer Pathways, and what excites you most about this role at HCCC?

My inspiration comes from my experience as a first-generation, non-traditional college student and a proud graduate of Hudson County Community College. When I started at HCCC, I wanted more than just a degree; I sought guidance, confidence, and the skills to create a successful future. The support from advisors and teachers helped me succeed and believe in myself. This experience sparked my passion for this work. What excites me most about this role is being able to give back to the school that was so important in my life. I believe in HCCC's mission to serve a diverse range of students through equity, access, and opportunity. I want to help students who, like me, might be balancing many responsibilities or starting their own paths for the first time, and help them succeed with clear guidance and confidence.

As a returning student, I understand how overwhelming it can be to navigate transfer options or explore careers. What is one piece of advice or a motto that guides you in your professional journey?

As a first-generation, non-traditional student, I understand that everyone's path is unique. In my professional journey, I lead with empathy, respect, and purpose, always striving to comprehend the complete picture of a student's life so I can provide meaningful support. Career and Transfer Plan

The Career and Transfer Plan outlines the key steps you should take during your time at HCCC to successfully launch your career, transfer to a four-year institution, or pursue both pathways.

Early Stages (0-14 credits)	 Self-Assessment: Take <u>career assessments</u> or <u>interest inventories</u> to identify potential career paths that align with your interests and strengths. Download Handshake App: Download the <u>Handshake app</u>, create your profile, and begin exploring internships, part-time jobs, and other career opportunities. Explore Career Options: Research career opportunities using resources such as <u>Career Coach</u>, O*NET OnLine, and the <u>Occupational Outlook Handbook</u> to learn about various industries related to your major. Begin Networking: Join <u>campus clubs or organizations</u> connected to your field of interest and start building your network through volunteering or participating in events. Jobs/Internships: Use Handshake to search for jobs and internship opportunities to gain experience in different industries. 	 Research: Explore transfer schools by visiting their websites, attending info sessions or college fairs, and consult with the Career and Transfer Pathways Office for guidance on aligning your academic choices with your career goals. Academic Advisement OR EOF Advisement: Meet with an academic/EOF advisor at the college to discuss your transfer goals. They can guide you on the appropriate courses to take and ensure you are on track to meet transfer requirements. NOTE: Only students admitted to the EOF program can utilize EOF advisement. General Education Courses: Focus on completing your general education requirements, as these are typically transferable to most universities. Consult with your advisor to determine which courses fulfill these requirements. IMPORTANT! Keep all of the syllabi from your courses. Some universities/colleges determine the level of class to place you in depending on the learning objectives of the course. 	
Mid-Stages (15-29 credits)	 Resume Building: Create or update your resume by attending workshops and using CareerOneStop's Resume Guide. Career Advising: Schedule a meeting with a career and transfer coach or specialist to discuss your career goals, pathways, and strategies for gaining relevant experience. Workshops/Job Fairs: Register for and attend career skills workshops (e.g., resume writing, interview techniques) and job fairs to expand your knowledge and connections. Complete Your Handshake Profile: Create or refine your Handshake profile and add any relevant experiences and start connecting with potential employers. 	 Target Schools: Narrow down your list of potential transfer universities based on your research and personal preferences. Visit their websites and attend transfer information sessions or campus tours to gather more information. NJTransfer: Explore how your HCCC credits will transfer to four-year institutions. If you have an intended major, use NJTransfer to identify the prerequisite courses required by your target universities. Maintain a Strong GPA: Maintain a strong GPA by keeping both your cumulative GPA (all courses) and major GPA (major-related courses) above the minimum required by transfer schools, as both are often considered in applications.

Preparing for Career (30-44 credits)	 Internships/Work-Based Learning: Apply for internships and experiential leaning opportunities via Handshake to gain practical, firsthand experience in your field. Mock Interviews: Participate in mock interview sessions and use Handshake's resources to practice your interview skills. Research Job Markets: Use Handshake to research different job markets, industries, and employers that align with your career goals. Networking Events: Attend Handshakehosted employer info sessions, career fairs, and other networking opportunities to build valuable connections. 	 Transfer Agreements: Visit the transfer agreement webpage to determine if your major pathway has an existing articulation agreement with the listed college/universities. These agreements outline the courses that will transfer and fulfill major requirements at the receiving institution. Connect with Target Schools: Attend a campus tour or onsite visit of a university or college you are interested in transferring to receive information on application deadlines, application fee waivers, housing and scholarship opportunities. Check-in with Academic Advisement OR EOF Advisement: Check in with your academic advisor during this stage to discuss your progress, ensure you're meeting the necessary academic requirements, and get their input on your transfer plans. Extracurricular Activities: Engage in extracurricular activities, such as clubs or volunteer work, to enhance your transfer application. These activities demonstrate your involvement and commitment outside of academics.
Application and Final Stages (45-60 credits)	 Update Your Resume: Update your resume so that is reflects your current experience and aligns with jobs in your field of interest. For assistance with updating your resume, visit the Career OneStop website. Identify Relevant Jobs: Identify positions that align with your work experience. Set up job alerts on Handshake for positions that match your skills and interests. Apply for Jobs/Internships: Use Handshake to apply for full-time jobs and internships. Interview Preparation: Prepare for interviews by meeting with a member of the Career and Transfer Pathways team to ensure that you are exemplifying NACE's Career Readiness Competencies. Finalize Your Career Plans: Review job offers carefully, considering responsibilities, company culture, salary, benefits, and career 	 Check with Registrar Office regarding Graduation: Confirm you're on track to graduate by consulting the Registrar's Office. For details and to complete the process, visit: HCCC Graduation Requirements and Application Financial Aid: Research and apply for transfer-specific financial aid and scholarships. Contact the financial aid office at your selected transfer schools. NOTE: Log into your FAFSA application and update your school to the selected transfer school. Complete Your Transfer Process: Complete your transfer process by getting recommendation letters, writing a strong personal statement, submitting applications, and sending transcripts via the National Student

How did transferring affect your career goals or opportunities?

Transferring had a great impact on my opportunities because it opened up more possibilities for me. At Rutgers, I was able to participate in multiple club organizations as a committee and board member to expand on my leadership skills. I also attended multiple job fairs to learn more about different companies and job roles, & participated in campus events designed to keep students actively involved. As a student, it made me feel my university supported me beyond academia, but also for my personal growth.

Can you describe any challenges you faced when transferring and how you overcame them?

My biggest challenge during the transfer process was the onset of COVID-19. The shift to a fully online first year highlighted the resilience I needed in order to succeed. I took the initiative to research the school thoroughly, identifying the key contacts for financial aid and counseling to ensure I stayed on track for graduation. This experience demonstrated my ability to adapt and thrive in any circumstances.

What motivated you to pursue your chosen career path?

My career path has been something I truly would not have imagined for myself. I had always considered various industries that aligned with my strengths and values, but it was my time at Hudson that truly illuminated my passion for helping others and solving problems. I discovered a deep satisfaction in providing support and finding solutions, which inspired me to pursue a major in Business Administration. This field allowed me to explore diverse areas within business while continuing to do what I enjoy.

What resources or support systems were most helpful during your transfer process?

The support systems I found most beneficial were the counseling and career services departments. They guided me through essential transfer requirements, including prerequisite courses, minimum GPA standards, and timely submission of transcripts. Their assistance not only clarified the transfer process but also helped me enhance my time management and organizational skills, ensuring that all necessary documents were prepared and submitted promptly.

How did the career services at HCCC and your new college/university help you in your job search?

Career services at HCCC and Rutgers assisted with my job search with resume building. Both institutions made sure I had a solid foundation that I can continue to build on as I gain more experience. Additionally, I was introduced to student-focused job boards and had the opportunity to connect with various professionals, which deepened my understanding of my desired industries.






